






Inner Harbor Volumes (Vehicles)




Inner Harbor Volumes (Vehicles)



Inner Harbor Volumes (High & Heavy)









Market Study



Port Freeport's public facilities are multi-purpose and receive a diversified range of cargo types including containers (refrigerated and dry), roll-on/roll-off ("RORO") cargo, breakbulk and project cargoes, and dry bulk commodities. Market opportunities change frequently and are influenced by:

- A rapidly growing Texas market
- Market competition
- · Evolving e-commerce and changes in consumer purchasing preferences
- · Federal regulations on various modes of the Transportation
- Deeper channel depths required for larger ocean-going vessels
- Supply chain pressures and labor disruptions on the U.S. west coast and in Mexico
- The need for multiple Texas deepwater port options for weather events and/or channel closures

Market Study



To complement the ongoing port planning and resulting infrastructure development, Port Freeport should commission a Market Study to:

- Identify specific targets/accounts, commodity/cargo segments and develop a Market Capture strategy.
 - Determine a plan of action needed to meet and serve the needs of the identified opportunities.
 - Market capture strategy should coincide with the anticipated market demand for the Port's services.
- Identify the potential cargo activities that could occur at Port Freeport.
 - Determine the type of facilities needed for the Port to participate in the short, medium and long-term planning horizons.
- Hone the focus of the business development and sales and marketing plans.



Standard & Poors' Debt Rating

• Standard & Poors' (S&P) will publish ratings for the Port's bonds to inform investors A+/Stable rating for outstanding revenue bonds

Debt Service Coverage is a key component of the ratings along with analysis of the overall financial condition, area economy, competitive position, customer/revenue base and management practices.

- Debt Service Coverage (DSC) is Net Revenue divided by scheduled Debt Service
- Net Revenue = Operating Income + Depreciation + M&O Tax Proceeds

Revenue Bond Considerations

- 2023 Modeling by Masterson based on a \$25M issuance with current projections of maintaining an A+ rating
 - Additional debt issuances should target a DSC of 1.80 or higher
 - Annual Debt Service Coverage minimum of 2.40
 - Maximum Annual Debt Service Coverage of 1.97
- Debt Service Covenant requires a 1.25 Debt Service Coverage Ratio
 - 2024 Debt Service Coverage = 1.97
 - Includes new debt and G.O. Bond Cash Subsidy (\$1M encumbered)

- Hierarchy of Travel Authorization
- Hierarchy of Expense Report Approvals
- Port Travelers are expected to exercise the same care in incurring expenses that a prudent person would exercise when traveling on personal business
- Not allowed:
 - > Fines for parking or moving vehicle violations
 - Movies, plays, concerts, or sporting event tickets (unless associated with a pre-approved thirdparty Meals and Business Entertainment)
 - Personal items, such as alcoholic beverages, personal entertainment, newspapers, toiletries, cigarettes, laundry and dry cleaning etc. and more that one personal phone call a day
 - Expenses for persons not employed by the Port who accompany a Port Traveler. Additionally, expenses for persons who accompany Port Travelers and who are included in business entertainment must be reported by employee and will be deducted from any funds due to the employee
- Port Travelers who travel on Port business on behalf of or with third parties shall not benefit financially by retaining any expense reimbursement from such other parties
- Unless otherwise agreed to in a valid, authorized written agreement with the Port, consultants, contractors, or other vendors who travel on Port business shall be reimbursed for travel expenses based on the same policies as apply to Port Travelers

Transportation Expenses:

- Reasonable
- Air travel, coach class (with extended leg room if needed), unless international flights exceeding four hours
- Early check in
- Travel to and from airport will be reimbursed
- Ground transportation
- Parking

Lodging:

Reasonable based on location and availability

Meals:

Reasonable, no alcohol

Registration Fees etc. associated with event

Business Meals and Entertainment:

- Must have a Port business purpose
- Reasonable
- The Port shall not reimburse for the cost of alcoholic beverages in connection with business meals and entertainment at which no third party is in attendance
- Highest ranking Port employee present at the meeting should incur the cost of the business meals and entertainment
- Expense report requirements:
 - Date, location, description, and purpose
 - Name, title and organization of attendees
 - Certain activities are not reimbursable under federally-funded programs and Port reserves the right to decline approval of such expenses



Finally...

- ✓ Travel/Expense Statement (Port has an excel form) reports are required.
- ✓ Must be submitted with required documentation (receipts) monthly or if a special trip or activity withing 30 days after completion.
